## **PURPOSE:**

The Program for Breast Cancer in Young Adults and the Breast Cancer Resource Center will be exploring the complex intersection of breast cancer and pregnancy. Dr. Amanda Manorot and Dr. Erin Cobain will discuss how to navigate a new cancer diagnosis during pregnancy, including the impact of imaging and treatment on maternal and fetal health. The webinar will also address delivery planning with a cancer diagnosis, considerations around breastfeeding after treatment, and the emotional and psychological effects of having to stop—or not being able to start—breastfeeding. Finally, the session will cover future fertility and considerations for pregnancy after cancer treatment. Ideal for patients, caregivers, and healthcare professionals seeking guidance in this nuanced area of care.

### **LEARNING OUTCOME:**

Health professionals will have new knowledge of how to care for their pregnant patients who are either newly diagnosed with cancer or are cancer survivors. Survivors and those newly diagnosed who attend will leave with a greater understanding of how to navigate their cancer and pregnancy experience.
